# Teaching and Learning

Resilient, collaborative, independent, ambitious, curious

- EYFS is built around 'Learning through Play' and child led learning
- Nursery children access free play opportunities throughout the day.
- Their play is enhanced by the adults around them, focusing on the seven key early years areas of development -

Physical
Personal, social and emotional
Communication and language
Maths
Literacy (reading, writing and phonics)
Art and design
Understanding of the world






I'm spotting patterns.
Noticing changes.
Subitising amounts.
Counting.
Recognising digits

#### These all help me with early maths skills.









I'm hearing and singing songs.

Recalling shared rhymes.

Making sense of rhythm.

Enjoying word games.

Making funny sounds with my body and my mouth.

These all help me to become a reader







I'm chatting to myself, my friends and toys to help me with my listening skills.

Joining social skills for conversation.

Enjoying stories and rhyme.

I am learning to balance so that when I am older and when I am ready, I can write using my core, shoulder, arm, wrist, hand and finger strength.







## Tapestry

Tapestry is our online learning journey.

We have sent out an email and you should now be able to access your child's learning journey. We ask that you do not share any pictures on social media as there will often be other children

on the photos.

Please feel free to add to the learning journey with photos of outings, family celebrations and visits. We share these on our screen with the children and it helps with recall, sequencing and confidence.



#### Timetable

- Morning Session is 8.50-11.50am. The afternoon session is 11.50-2.50pm. Reception children come in before Nursery.
- As you know we line up along the railings.
- ▶ If your child is upset when you leave please feel free to phone/text school.
- We have several short carpet sessions during the day where we may share a stories, listen to news, play listening games or look at numbers and counting.
- We also show, celebrate and talk about the work that we are excited about.
  Plan Do Review.
- The children have access to free play activities both inside and out and may also be encouraged to complete a more focused activity.
- We also have funky fingers, dough disco and squiggle wiggle sessions to help with our fine motor skills ready for writing.
- We have PE sessions during the week where the focus is on gross motor skills and different ways of moving and balancing.
- All of our planning is based around the seven areas of learning and we call it a learning overview, which you will receive via email.





#### Routines

When the children arrive in Nursery we have a self registration system which helps with counting and finding their friends.

When the children hear the bells we put one hand in the air and say team stop, ready to listen to the instructions.

We encourage the children to be as independent as possible during the day:-

Using a knife and fork
Toileting and hand washing
Finding our own things
Putting on our coats, cardigans and jumpers
Tidying up (we have our own little song!)

Please help us by labelling all your child's belongings including lunchboxes on the outside.

Please send in a water bottle for during the day, we ask that it is just water and labelled clearly.

#### Snack and lunch time

- We have a selection of fruit at snack time. You can send in your own snack but we ask that it is just fruit.
- We encourage the children to be as independent as possible pouring their own drinks and taking turns to wash and dry up.
- We eat our lunch in Nursery/snack table.
- We do not encourage the sharing of food at lunch time as we have several children with severe allergies including milk and peanuts.
- ► We therefore ask that you do not give your child peanut butter sandwiches.



# Reading

We are passionate about all children developing a love of reading.

#### In Nursery we

- Handle lots of books
- Read lots of stories
- Discuss the illustrations
- Verbally tell the story from the picture or props.
- Use story mountain to make up our own stories.
- Make predictions
- Read from left to right
- Encourage children to point to letters that they know
- Join in with repeated refrains







# Writing in Nursery

- Encourage ANY mark making- it's NEVER just scribble. We have writing boxes in every area.
- We encourage children to write a label if they want to keep their model.
- Physical development making the body ready to write. E.g shaving foam, play dough (Dough Disco) scarves(Squiggle Wiggle)

This is why PE, outside play and funky fingers are so important

- Marks on a paper- understanding that marks have a meaning and physically making marks
- Emergent phase usually containing letters of their name- what does it say?
- Know their name (recognise and write)





#### **Phonics**

- In school we use RWI for our phonics.
- ► In Nursery don't usually start more formal phonic sessions until the summer term before the children start Reception.
- Instead we focus on

**Nursery Rhymes** 

Listening games

Sharing stories

Speech and language

Vocabulary - story of the week.

Rhyming – Nursery Rhyme of the week.

Blending

Become familiar with the rhymes linked to the sounds.

In the summer term we begin more structured phonics sessions.

# What can I do to support my child at home?

- Listening walks
- Helping with independence toileting, eating, coats and jumpers
- Encourage mark making and question them about the marks they make.
- Read stories and poems at home, talk about them and ask questions.
- Language is so important because if children can't say it, they can't write it!
- ▶ Look out for numbers in the environment, count steps/cars etc.
