

- · Windsor Castle and The Tower of London still exist today.

### Significant Person

There is a standing myth that Richard II (1377-99) placed treasure in the well at Beeston castle.

#### Vocabulary A large building, typically from medieval times, protected by castle thick walls, battlements, towers and often a moat. From the 11th to the 16th century. medieval King and The male or female ruler of a Queen country. Important people who own and Lord and run the castle. Lords are men Lady and ladies are women. 






# Read Write Inc.


- Daily lessons in small groups

- Reading diaries and reading books MUST be in school every day and will be checked on Fridays









## Seesaw

1. Seesaw can be downloaded as an app or you can view it at <a href="https://web.seesaw.me/">https://web.seesaw.me/</a>


The app is called 'seesaw' and looks like this:






